EASTER - FOOD FOR THOUGHT - Where does betrayal begin? We read in John 13:27, "And after the sup Satan entered into Judas. Then Jesus said unto Judas, 'What you are about to do, do quickly.'" This was not where the betrayal started. In Matthew 26;6-13, we find that, "when Jesus was in Bethany at the house of Simon the leper, a woman came to Him having an alabaster flask of very costly fragrant oil, and she poured it on His head as He sat at the table. But when His disciples saw it, they were indignant, saying, "Why this waste? For this fragrant oil might have been sold for much and given to the poor."



But when Jesus was aware of it, He said to them, "Why do you trouble the woman? For she has done a good work for Me. For you have the poor with you always, but Me you do not have always. For in pouring this fragrant oil on My body, she did it for My burial". If Jesus is the Son of God, the Messiah, the King of the Jews, then His talk of poverty always existing, of Him leaving, and or of His burial, might be unsettling to anyone looking to Him to be a deliverer from oppression, and one who would usher in universal prosperity. Sin starts with a thought in the heart, and that is where a betrayal begins. Matthew 26:14-16 says, "Then one of the twelve, called Judas Iscariot, went to the chief priests, and said, "What are you willing to give me if I deliver Him to you?" And they counted out to him thirty pieces of silver. So, from that time he sought opportunity to betray Him."

Luke 22:1-7 records, "Now the Feast of Unleavened Bread drew near, which is called Passover. And the chief priests and the scribes sought how they might kill Him, for they feared the people. Then Satan entered Judas Iscariot, who was numbered among the twelve. So, he went his way and conferred with the chief priests and captains, how he might betray Him to them. And they were glad, and agreed to give him money. So, he promised and sought opportunity to betray Him to them in the absence of the multitude. Then came the Day of Unleavened Bread, when the Passover must be killed." These events, prior to the last supper, would bring Judas to the meal with his mind on finding an "opportunity to betray Him." With his mind on that and his heart not with Christ, it isn't hard to see why he wasn't responding to the grace Jesus was giving him during that foot washing and meal time. Judas' prior thoughts and actions had so set the stage that he was no longer seeing with any understanding or conviction. His heart was hardened through his previous meditations of evil. In Luke 21:37, we read, "And in the daytime Jesus was teaching in the temple, but at night He went out and stayed on the mountain called Olivet. After the Passover meal, Luke 22:39 says, He went to the Mount of Olives, as He was accustomed, and His disciples also followed Him." What Jesus commissioned Judas to do quickly was to do what was already in his heart---go that very night and get the rulers and chief priests and lead them to the garden of Gethsemane on the Mount of Olives. Things were not out of control--this was God's doing--timing that had been eternally set.

Betrayal, regardless of any gain never leads to happiness and peace in the inner man. Matthew 27;1-5 tells of Judas' end. "When morning came, all the chief priests and elders of the people plotted against Jesus to put Him to death. And when they had bound Him, they led Him away and delivered Him to Pontius Pilate the governor. Then Judas, His betrayer, seeing that He had been condemned, was remorseful and brought back the thirty pieces of silver to the chief priests and elders, saying, "I have sinned by betraying innocent blood." And they said, "What is that to us? You see to it!" Then he threw down the pieces of silver in the temple and departed, and went and hanged himself." 1 Timothy 6::9-12 tells us, "But those who desire to be rich fall into temptation and a snare, and into many foolish and harmful lusts which drown men in destruction and perdition. For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil, for which some have strayed from the faith in their greediness, and pierced themselves through with many sorrows.

But you, O man of God, flee these things and pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, patience, gentleness. Fight the good fight of faith, lay hold on eternal life, to which you were also called and have confessed the good confession in the presence of many witnesses." Fighting the good fight of faith is more than believing and trusting the words of God, but it is also trusting and believing the character of the God behind those words. In the garden of Eden, original sin came about when Adam was willing to entertain the thought that not only was what God said wrong, but that His very character was questionable. In a sense, this was the first betrayal, and with the betrayer came death for all.

In the garden of Gethsemane, the last Adam appealed for any other way than the cross, but never wavered on the set purpose or character of God, and therefore, was able to face death on a cross and say, "nevertheless, not my will, but Yours be done." His faithfulness not only justified His being brought back to life, but brought justification and life for all who would believe in Him. Where does unbelief and betrayal begin? In the thoughts of the heart. Where does faith and faithfulness begin? In the thoughts of the heart. Why is meditation on the word of God so important? Because it feeds the heart truth upon which to think in one's heart. Verses to contemplate: Proverbs 23:7 - "For as he thinks in his heart, so is he;" Matthew 15:18-20 - "But those things which proceed out of the mouth come from the heart, and they defile a man. For out of the heart proceed evil thoughts, murders, adulteries, fornications, thefts, false witness, blasphemies. These are the things which defile a man.;" Luke 6:45 - "A good man out of the good treasure of his heart brings forth good; and an evil man out of the evil treasure of his heart brings forth evil. For out of the abundance of the heart his mouth speaks;" Proverbs 4:23 - "Keep your heart with all diligence, for out of it spring the issues of life."; Psalm 119:9-11 - "How can a young man cleanse his way? By taking heed according to Your word. With my whole heart I have sought You; oh, let me not wander from Your commandments! Your word I have hidden in my heart, that I might not sin against You.;" Psalm 1:1-3 -"Blessed is the man who walks not in the counsel of the ungodly, nor stands in the path of sinners, nor sits in the seat of the scornful; but his delight is in the law of the Lord, and in His law, he meditates day and night. He shall be like a tree planted by the rivers of water, that brings forth its fruit in its season, whose leaf also shall not wither; and whatever he does shall prosper.;" Romans 12:1-2 - "Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God."




